What is Care for Caregivers?

Our Care for Caregivers service consists of monthly one to one sessions offered to those providing therapeutic care to children and young people. It focuses on the well-being and development of the staff providing care.

Care for Caregivers ensures that staff are emotionally regulated and receive support for any traumatic incident that they experience. The service provides additional support for staff to enable them to process any difficult situations in order for them to remain emotionally available to the young people they care for.

What is the purpose of Care for Caregivers?

The purpose of providing employees with individual access to psychotherapeutic supervision is to ensure that all staff remain emotionally regulated and to enable emotionally regulated responses to the children in their care.

What are the benefits of Care for Caregivers?

- Regulates staff
- Improves staff wellbeing
- Reduces staff turnover
- Lowers recruitment costs

The cost of recruitment has largely increased over the past couple of years. Dysregulated staff will not only contribute to the children, but also the morale and high staff turnover leading to higher recruitment costs.

Case Study:




We have been providing the staff at Life Change Care Limited with Care for Caregivers for the past couple of years.
